## **Diabetes Calls**

## **Keep in Mind:**

- > Patients with Diabetes often have co-morbidities that complicate your triage. Other considerations: Eye disease; Heart disease; Kidney disease; Stroke
- > DKA can resemble ETOH or drug impairment (don't assume!) Fruity odor to breath, SOB, weakness, slurred speech, confusion.
- > An overdose of Diabetes Medication (oral or insulin) can be a medical emergency- rule out 911 first before asking PMH questions.
- > EVERYTHING can affect blood sugars (ex: Prednisone, Good stress/ bad stress, exercise, missing meals, fatigue, headache
- > Hyperglycemia: "Hot and dry sugar high" frequent urinations; increased thirst; blurred vision; fatigue; headache
- > Hypoglycemia: "Cold and Clammy- Needs some candy"- shakiness, weakness, not thinking clearly, headache, trembling, sweating, dizziness, palpitations, and hunger
- > Quick treatment for low blood sugar is: DO NOT OVEREAT! 3 teaspoons of honey, 3-4 glucose tabs, 1 cup milk, 1/2 cup juice of soda (not diet soda). Follow this treatment w/in 15 minutes with protien- cheese and crackers, glass of milk, 1/2 sandwich, etc.
